PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the District Court of the United States, Northern District of Illinois:

The petition of OLOF AUGUST BERGQUIST hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is 2244 N. Kenneth Ave., Chicago, Illinois.

Second. My occupation is Carpenter.

Third. I was born on the 26th day of September, anno Domini 1 878, at Ransater, Sweden.

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Montreal, Canada, on or about the 20th day of October anno Domini 1 922, and arrived in the United States, at the port of Newark Buffalo, N. Y., on the 22nd day of October anno Domini 1 922 on the vessel G. T. Ry.

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 17th day of November, anno Domini 1 923 at Chicago, Ill., in the Circuit Court of Cook County.

Sixth. I am no married. My ^{wife's} ~~husband's~~ name is Alma; ^{she} ~~he~~ was born on the 2nd day of May, anno Domini 1 885 at Sweden, and now resides at with me, Chicago, Illinois.

I have no children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Gustavus V, King of Sweden of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 22nd day of October, anno Domini 1 922, and in the State of Illinois, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 10th day of November, anno Domini 1 922, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (~~I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court.~~) the Circuit Court of Cook County at Chicago, Ill., on the 17th day of November, anno Domini 1 923, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
